OVERVIEW

The research initiative involved experienced teachers (co-operating teachers generally) working in partnership with student teachers from the Professional Masters in Education (PME) course to plan, deliver and reflect on a team teaching experience.

The purpose of this research project was to facilitate the development of team teaching skills among individual student teachers and their co-operating teachers, and to disseminate the learning in schools and among others not directly included in the project.
